Kyoto Filmmakers Lab (KFL) is a workshop that produces short period drama films using the open sets of Toei Kyoto Studio and Shochiku Studio, targeting young filmmakers from Japan and overseas (English is the official language). The workshop provides an opportunity to experience authentic period drama using the same facilities and equipment as those used in feature films, including period sets, art, lighting, and costumes. It also supports networking between young filmmakers from Japan and abroad.

This year marks the 15th anniversary of the event, and in anticipation of the government's relaxation of border control measures, overseas participants were recruited for both the "Hands-on Period Drama" and "Masters Session" programs. The recruitment was conducted through a web application process from July 20th (Wed) to September 2nd (Fri), with separate applications for each program. As a result, there were 121 applicants (20 residing in Japan) from 32 countries for the "Hands-on JIDAIGEKI" program, and 45 applicants (10 residing in Japan) from 18 countries for the "Masters Session" program. After the selection process, 20 participants (including 10 residing in Japan) were chosen for the "Hands-on Period Drama" program, and 19 participants (including 9 residing in Japan) were selected for the "Masters Session" program.

<Hands-on JIDAIGEKI>

Under the supervision of Keijiro Miyanishi (Director of Photography, Toei) and Satoshi Nagashima (Producer, Shochiku), a hands-on JIDAIGEKI production with direct guidance will be held from November 7th (Monday) to November 9th (Wednesday), 2022, for three days at Toei Kyoto Studios and Shochiku Studios.

<Masters Session>

From November 3rd (Thu, national holiday) to November 6th (Sun), 2022, thirteen sessions including practical sword-fighting lessons will be held at The Museum of Kyoto and the Kyu-butokuden. Please note that accommodation will not be provided in the usual

camp-style format due to the measures taken to prevent the spread of the COVID-19, and participants are required to make their own arrangements.

- "The Third Wheel/晴れて成仏" written by Hikari Onodera (Shochiku Team)

For the Hands-On JIDAIGEKI, we have selected the top 20 participants based on the evaluation scores from the above-mentioned screening committee. We have assigned each participant to their respective roles based on their scores and preferences.
